

Explored the Unexplord Hakusan Super RindoForest

This Forest Road of 33.3km was constructed in 1967 as a "special forest area development road (Super Rindo)", with the purpose to develop unexplored forestresources in the area between Ishikawa and Gifu Prefecture. The Forest Road was opened in August, 1977.

◆ Fukube-no-otaki Waterfall (900m above the sea)

With a height of 86m, this is the greatest waterfall of Jatani Valley. The water from the waterfall might even splash onto the road at times.



◆ Sanpoiwa Parking Lot (1,450m above the sea)

With a parking lot available, this is the highest point of the Forest Road. Tourists can hike along the mountain trail all the way to the top of Mt. Sanpoiwa (1736m) and enjoy the spectacular view of sceneries and autumn foliage of nearby mountains.



◆ Renny Chaya Resting Area (1,200m above the sea)

Inside the 1200m high Shirakawago Tenbodai Parking lot of Hakusan Super Rindo Forest Road, this Teahouse was given the name "Renny" because it was built on the path where "Renny Shonin", or the "eminent monk" passed by. Tourists can take a break from their trip and relax.

◆ Hakusan Nature Preservation Center



◆ Jadani Nature Observation Park

At the back of the Hakusan Nature Preservation Center, you will find a walking trail along Jatani River that stretches all the way to Jadani

◆ Ichirino Onsen

Tourists can enjoy various kinds of hotsprings include the outside bath as well as relaxing in the "Hakusan Ichirino Citizens Relaxation Zone" where guests can get a taste of hotsprings while surrounded by beautiful nature.

◆ Oyadaninoyu Hotspring: Ubagataki Waterfall

Constructed with a walking trail, Oyadaninoyu Hotspring is an outdoor bath with hotspring water originated from the bottom of the river. Tourists can enjoy the fantastic view of the Ubagataki Waterfall.



Was selected as one of the "Japan's 100 Most Beautiful Waterfalls" in 1990.

◆ Hakusan Observation Deck (1300m above the sea)

Around this area you can view the rare primeval forest of beech trees; tourists can also enjoy the magnificent view from the top of Mt. Hakusan.



◆ World Heritage : Shirakawago Gassho-zukuri

Registered as a World Heritage on December 6th, 1995, you will find 112 Gassho-zukuri houses preserved here and are still in use today. And inside the 24 Gassho private lodging facilities, guests can gather around the fireplace and enjoy chit-chat.

◆ Chugu Onsen (600m above the sea)

With a legend that it was discovered by "Taicho Taishi" — the monk who opened up Mt. Hakusan, this hotspring is said to be very good for stomach and intestinal

Outline of Hakusan Super Rindo Forest Road

This Forest Road of 33.3km was constructed in 1967 as a "special forest area development road (Super Rindo)", with the purpose to develop unexplored forest

- **Area** From Ozo area in Hakusan City, Ishikawa Prefecture to Hatogaya area in Ono-gun Shirakawa-mura, Gifu Prefecture
- **Width** 6.5m (2-lane in all areas)
- **In-service Period** June 5th–November 10th (subject to change)

- ① Please be careful especially around sharp curves
- ② Please be aware that various regulations will be put into place according to certain weather conditions, so please follow any instructions given by the staff.
- ③ Emergency phones are installed at 17 locations, every 2km between the 2 management offices

- ④ The Forest Road is within the area of a National Park and a National Forest, therefore actions such as harvesting/collecting of plants, animal hunting, camping and preparing campfire are strictly prohibited. Any of the above actions are punishable by law.
- ⑤ Please carry back your garbage with you such as empty
